

Derbyshire Domesday 1086.

Below is a translation of the Domesday Book's Derbyshire section created by the late Marie Roesdahl, originally using the 1885 Feudal History of the County of Derby by JP Yeatman, (which can be found at the American Libraries internet archive here: <http://www.archive.org/details/duomesdaybookfor00yeat>) and correcting Yeatman's book, which was a product of its time. For a line by line comparison of the Latin text with an English translation see Roffe, 1986, noting there are some minor errors which have since been identified in it. For a more up to date academic introduction and translation of Domesday, see Thorn 2007.

In the 1086 Domesday original, Derby is at the end of the Derbyshire section next to Nottingham. The reason for this is that the shire counties of Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire were relatively new creations in 1086 (Derbyshire is first mentioned in the Anglo-Saxon Chronicle in 1048). The two shires had been created out of the former Mercian Province of the Pecsæte (the Peak District), so for some time they continued to be linked together as an administrative unit, there being only one Sherriff for both shires, for example.

For convenience Derby is put at the start here, before the rest of the text which is in the same order as in Yeatman i.e. as it appears in Domesday. There is only one other town identified in Domesday for Derbyshire in 1086 (with a town population apparently separately identified from its manor population) and that is Wirksworth. In all other cases the population totals are for whole manors including any outliers that are part of them, though a few manors have some people attached to a church in a particular manor (e.g. Ashbourne and Bakewell). A few other locations later grow into towns such as Castleton and Chesterfield (Beresford and Finberg, 1973) but in 1086 Derby and Wirksworth appear to be the only towns.

In the section of Domesday Book which deals with Derbyshire, places (manors) are listed first by landholder and then by wapentake. So you may have to search (use the search tool in the pdf header) to find a particular manor and more than one landholder may own bits of it, so it may be listed in more than one place. Roffe (1986) provides both a good basic text as well as the original Latin in a very useful paragraph by paragraph comparison. This can be compared with a recent updating and heavyweight academic commentary by Thorn (2007) which seeks to insert some of the missing Wapentake headings and corrects a number of identified errors, and which Marie has included here as well.

Some general notes.

A carucate is 120 acres.

A bovate is 15 acres.

A league is one and a half miles.

A thrave is two stooks of 12 sheaves (so 24 sheaves).

Domesday lists "Plumbariae" - this is often wrongly translated as lead mines, they are much more probably Lead Works (Smelters) as it takes many mines to supply one smelter. In so far as a lead mine in 1086 is a hole in the ground, it is hardly to be conceived that the clerks of Domesday are going round counting holes in the ground.

At the start of a paragraph:

M means a Manor and 2M means there are two of them

S means a Soke (an estate, sometimes called a jurisdiction)

B means a Berewick, an outlier or outlying farm, part of the manor

Thoughts on population.

An estimate of the total population for locations listed can be had by adding up the people listed in the manor and multiplying it by 6 and adding 5% for slaves, though this may still represent a serious under-estimate - remember Domesday is not a census, it's a tax document and it isn't that accurate in the modern sense. Also not all places can be identified: some have died out e.g. Padinc, somewhere near Greyhirst. Where the location is not known any more it is usually in brackets (Padinc). The Derbyshire population in Domesday is thought to be an underestimate (see Stafford, 1985, p21) partly because of the haphazard recording of Sokemen (a kind of rent payer) who are well recorded in other counties but appear only infrequently in Derbyshire. One of the reasons Derbyshire presents such problems is because it was one of the first to be done and it is more haphazard than later examples such as Cheshire, which have clearer structures.

Derby in Domesday Book:

"In the Borough of Derby before 1066 there were 243 resident burgesses. To this borough are attached 12 carucates of land taxable, which 8 ploughs can plough. This land was divided between 41 burgesses who also had 12 ploughs. From dues and tolls and fines and all customary dues, two parts were the King's, the third the Earl's. In the same borough 1 church was in the King's lordship (domain/ownership), with 7 priests, who held 2 carucates of land freely in Little Chester. There was also another church, likewise the King's, in which 6 priests held 9 bovates of land in Quarndon and Little Eaton, likewise freely. In the town itself were 14 mills.

Now there are 100 burgesses, and another 40 lesser burgesses. 103 messuages (dwellings with a courtyard or garden and outbuildings), which used to pay dues, are unoccupied. There are now 10 mills; meadow, 16 acres; underwood 3 furlongs long and 2 wide. In total, it paid £24 before 1066; now, with the mills and the village of Litchurch, it pays £30.

In Litchurch the King has 2 carucates of land taxable. Land for 3 ploughs. 1 Freeman and 9 villagers have 2 ploughs; meadow, 12 acres.

In Derby the Abbot of Burton has 1 mill and 1 messuage with full jurisdiction, and 2 messuages over which the King has jurisdiction, and 13 acres of meadow.

Geoffrey Alselin has 1 church, which was Toki son of Auti's.

Ralph son of Hubert has 1 church, which was Leofric brother of Leofnoth's, with 1 carucate of land.

Norman of Lincoln has 1 church which was Brun's.

Edric has there 1 church, which was his father Colne's.

Earl Hugh has 2 messuages and 1 fishery, with full jurisdiction.

Henry of Ferrers has 3 messuages, likewise with full jurisdiction.

Osmer the priest has 1 bovat of land with full jurisdiction.
Godwin the priest has 1 bovat of land likewise.

At Martinmas the burgesses pay the King 12 thraves of corn, of which the Abbot of Burton has 40 sheaves.

There are 8 further messuages in the same borough with full jurisdiction. They were Earl Algar's; now they are the King's.

The King's two pennies and the Earl's third which come from Appletree Wapentake in Derbyshire are in the sheriff's hands, or rather dues, by witness of the two shires.

Concerning Stori of Bolingbroke, Walter of Aincourt's predecessor, they say that he could make himself a church on his land and in his jurisdiction, without anyone's permission, and dispose of his tithe where he would."

Henry of Ferrers claims 1 carucate in HADDON.

M In LONGDENDALE and in THORNSETT Ligulf had 4 bovates of land taxable; in LUDWORTH Brun (had) 4 bovates of land; in CHARLESWORTH and CHISWORTH Swein (had) 1 carucate of land; in CHUNAL Aelmer (had) 4 bovates of land; in HADFIELD 4 bovates; in PADFIELD Leofing 1 carucate of land; in DINTING Leofnoth Star had 2 bovates of land; in (Old) GLOSSOP Leofing (had) 4 bovates of land; in WHITFIELD 4 bovates of land; in HAYFIELD Aelmer (had) 4 bovates of land; in KINDER Godric (had) 2 bovates of land. Between them all, 6 carucates of land taxable and 12 manors. The whole of Longdendale is waste. The woodland there is not pasturable, fit for hunting. The whole is 8 leagues long and 4 leagues wide. (Value) before 1066, 40s.

Value before 1066, 20s; now 16s.
